I wanted to say how grateful I am for the education I received as KGS pupil. I received an assisted place as my mum wouldn't have been able to afford to pay the fees, so I am hugely privileged they put faith and investment in 11 year old me.

I'm so very grateful for the support I received and encouragement that seemed to lift me above struggles I had at home. Knowing personally the difference a good education can make, has been one of the factors which have driven my wife and I to set up our free school, The Fulham Boys School. We have three young sons at primary school and where we live many parents either move out of the area to find better state schools or pay for education. We felt there should be more options than this so for the past 6 years we have been working on setting up a free school. This September I'm proud to say that we opened our doors to the first year of 110 boys and I'm so pleased to think we have created a local school our sons can attend, very much based on the values that became entrenched in my days at KGS.
